- ❑ Nazi Germany, the Communist Soviet Union, Korean dictatorships, etc. and atheist links
- ❑ Jesus' unifying message and the immense value He places on human life
- ❑ Emergence of Democracy and our education and legal systems
- ❑ The irresistible nature of Jesus' message and Christianity
- ❑ The end of slavery, racism, fear, inequality, etc. found in Christianity

According to Johnston, "The ultimate purpose of *Unimaginable* is to shed new light on old questions: Does God love me? How do I know? Does God still work in the world? Is there a divine purpose to my life? If Jesus had not come, would life really be different?"

## Suggested Interview Questions for Jeremiah J. Johnston, author of *Unimaginable*

1. How did *Unimaginable* come together?
2. The book is divided into three parts, each focused on a different aspect of your perspective – which is the most compelling to you? Why?
3. You include a lot of historical insight and examples of different worldviews. Won't there always be conflict between differing worldviews?
4. You say atheism is "dangerous" and has the bloodiest track record of any philosophy in human history. Please explain.
5. You say religion is the single most powerful force in changing history and bringing transformation in the world. But aren't all religions the same?
6. You outline the world's darkness before the coming of Christ in the opening section of *Unimaginable* – do you see that darkness being paralleled or echoed in our world today?
7. There were 5 philosophers who had a major impact on the western world negatively. Who were they and who would you say was the most dangerous?
8. You say, "Without God, something always fills the void." What do you mean by this? What are some current examples of this?
9. What Bible readings would you suggest for those who'd like to further examine the incredible shift in the world before and after Christ? (both Old and New Testament)
10. There are 7,487 promises from God in the Bible. In your opinion, what is the most important and why is it still relevant today?
11. Several divisive issues are brought up in the book: Racism, Women's Rights, Slavery, etc. What does Christianity have to do with these issues?
12. The book briefly touches on the push in our modern world for less Christianity in social, governmental, educational settings – what does this mean for our world? Is there hope?
13. You mention that the purpose of the book is to shed new light on old questions. One of those is: If Jesus had not come, would life really be different? What do you hope readers will conclude after reading this book?
